Subject: Thunderstorm Warning - Central Coast and Central Valley Regions.

All:

A Thunderstorm Warning is issued for the Central Coast and the Los Padres Divisions of the Central Coast Region and the Yosemite, Fresno, and Kern Divisions of the Central Valley Region for Sunday and Monday, October 17-18, 2010. This warning is valid from Sunday at noon until Monday evening at 8PM.

An upper air low pressure center will develop off the Central Coast of California early Sunday. This upper air low pressure center will move south parallel to the coast coast today through Monday and then southeast across Southern California on Tuesday and Wednesday before exiting the state. The moisture and instability associated with this upper level low pressure center increases the chance for scattered thundershowers over Central Coast and Central Valley Regions, primarily over the higher terrain this afternoon through Monday.
