**SUBJECT: Pacific Gas and Electric Company Moratorium on Disconnections
December 18, 2010 through January 2, 2011**

Dear President Peevey:

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby informs the California Public Utilities Commission of a voluntary moratorium on disconnections from December 18, 2010 through January 2, 2011.

Last year, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and the Southern California Gas Company (the "Utilities") all agreed to a moratorium on service disconnections from December 21, 2009 through January 3, 2010. PG&E recognizes that many of our customers continue to struggle during these challenging economic times. Consequently, PG&E determined that a moratorium on disconnections from December 18, 2010 through January 2, 2011 would help those customers who are struggling through the tough economy by not disconnecting them during the holiday season. PG&E will also continue to actively reach out to all customers to inform them of different ways they can reduce their bills and avoid disconnection, including low income programs, payment arrangements, assistance funds, and Medical Baseline. We will resume our complete collection and disconnection procedures beginning January 3, 2011.
