Preliminary results indicate taking Line 153 and 131 to 80% is doable with two caveats. First, Line 153 at 80% is 1 lb away from setting off alarms if there is a dig-in or some problem with the pipe. How bug a problem this is, I'm not sure. Second issue, Russell City is attached to Line 131 (or 153 - can't remember perfectly right now). Taking the line to 80% presents contractual problems for customers because we have guaranteed them a certain pressure. Beyond the monetary damages, we can't operate the pipeline at 80% once gas starts flowing to Russell City.
