Parties to R.10-05-006, R.08-08-009, and R.06-02-012:

This is a courtesy notice to inform you that Energy Division will host a training on the "33% RPS Calculator" on Friday, January 7, 2010, from 9 am to 1 pm at the California Public Utilities Commission at 505 Van Ness Avenue in San Francisco. The workshop will be held in either the Commission Auditorium or the Courtyard Room, depending on the number of attendees. Please RSVP to Anne Mills, aeg@cpuc.ca.gov, if you plan to attend, so that we can choose the most appropriate location.

The 33% RPS Calculator was developed by Energy and Environmental Economics, Inc. (E3), in consultation with Energy Division staff, to develop portfolios of resources that achieve a 33% RPS in 2020, as inputs to the utilities' system plans in the 2010 Long-Term Procurement Proceeding. The draft Calculator, underlying assumptions and methodology, and resulting 33% RPS scenarios were released in draft form this past June and subject to a round of comments and reply comments. The final Calculator, which was used to develop the required RPS scenarios released in the December 3, 2010 Scoping Memo (<http://docs.cpuc.ca.gov/EFILE/RULC/127542.htm>), is available on the 2010 LTPP website, http://www.cpuc.ca.gov/PUC/energy/Procurement/LTPP/ltppl_history.h

The purpose of this training is to educate parties about the updated Calculator's functioning and flexibility, so that parties can test alternate inputs and assumptions, identify key

variables that cause a significant change in the resources chosen to meet the RPS goal and, if desired, use the Calculator to develop alternate scenarios for consideration in the proceeding. Please note that this is a technical training on the Calculator, rather than a workshop on the planning assumptions adopted in the Scoping Memo. Specifics about the adopted inputs and assumptions will be discussed to the extent necessary to explain the functioning of the Calculator, but the adopted standardized planning assumptions and the Commission's consideration of party comments on the draft assumptions will not be the focus of the training.

We encourage parties to familiarize themselves with the final Calculator before the training. We also encourage parties to come to the training with laptops onto which the Calculator has already been downloaded, so that the session can be interactive and most helpful.
