



# Proposed Order of Events/Timeline

## Key Assumptions for All Remaining Customer Classes

- SmartMeter deployment nearer completion before defaults begin (end of 2012)
- All classes default to TOU first
- Opt-In CPP available for all classes starting end of 2012
- CPP or dynamic pricing default to follow at least one year after TOU. Customers can choose from two options, with one being defaulted if no choice is made.
