RF emissions resurface

in California bill: California Assemblyman Jared Huffman (D–Marin) introduced legislation yesterday that would force utilities to not only let customers reject wireless smart meters but also make smart grid reliability and efficiency available using wired technology, his office told the press. On top of that, the bill would force utilities to disclose RF emissions data to consumers. The bill directs the California PUC (CPUC) to temporarily suspend smart meter deployment in the state. The CPUC last week dismissed a petition by anti-smart meter group EMF Safety Network to examine the possible health impacts of RF emissions from Pacific Gas & Electric's (PG&E's) smart meters (SGT, <u>Dec-06</u>).

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
