

Reference: Notification of Temporary LNG Facilities - Dec 8 - Dec 23, 2010

In accordance with 49 CFR §193.2019(b), Pacific Gas and Electric Company is providing notice of the temporary siting of mobile LNG facilities.

Purpose: Emergency LNG injections will be performed for the purposes of LNG operator training and LNG equipment testing in preparation for Peak Shaving to meet core load in San Francisco for the winter of 2010/2011.

Yuba City - LNG injection will be performed in Yuba City at the underground gas holder, which serves the local gas distribution system. No customers will depend on this supplemental supply, as the pipeline is being used for take away purposes only. LNG injections will occur starting on December 8th.

San Francisco - LNG injections will be performed at two locations: San Francisco Gas Load Center and the Presidio. LNG will be injected into the local gas distribution system. These injections will be performed to prepare for site specific LNG operations for wintertime Peak Shaving. No customers will depend on this supplemental supply at this time as the injections are for site specific training and testing only. Injections will not be concurrent. LNG injections in San Francisco will occur starting on December 14th.

Location: The injection sites are as follows:

Leakage Control: A portable flammable gas indicator will be readily available. On-site personnel are trained to shut down or isolate various portions of the equipment and to take other applicable steps to ensure the escape of gas or liquid is cut off immediately, as required by the situation.

Fire fighting equipment:

- Dry chemical fire extinguishers (20 lb. Purple K) are placed at various locations in the jobsite
- Long gauntlet cryogenic gloves and/or gauntlet leather welding gloves are provided.
- Hard hat with full face shield
- Nomex Type III Coveralls

Methods employed to restrict public access:

In Yuba City the system will be located within the PG&E yard, which is entirely surrounded with security fencing. When left unmanned the system will be shut down and isolated from the injection point.

At the San Francisco injection points, PG&E employees will be onsite at all times with one employee specifically responsible for ensuring the public does not approach the equipment. Cones and ribbon will be placed as a perimeter around the entire injection site. After the equipment is shut down but still on site, a contract security officer will be present at all times.
