## CPUC INVESTIGATES ELECTROCUTIONS FROM EDISON POWER LINE IN SAN BERNARDINO

SAN FRANCISCO, January 14, 2011 - The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is investigating the electrocution of three people today in San Bernardino by a downed power line of Southern California Edison (SCE).

Early this morning, a 12,000 volt electric transmission line came down in the backyard of a residence in San Bernardino and three of the residents were **fatally** electrocuted.
