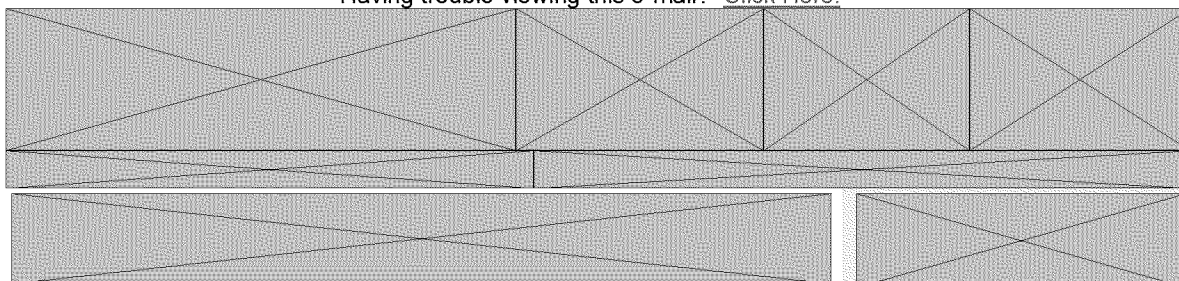

CPUC Hosts Public Hearing on Proposed AT&T/T-Mobile Merger July 7th

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) needs to hear from you at a public hearing on **Thursday, July 7, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. at the CPUC Auditorium** located at 505 Van Ness Ave. in San Francisco. **At the public hearing, you can tell the CPUC that you cannot support the merger unless important questions are answered.** To learn more about this and other public hearings and workshops at the CPUC please [click here](#)

As you have undoubtedly heard, AT&T has announced a deal to acquire T-Mobile for \$39 billion. If approved, the new company would have **130 million wireless subscribers, making it the largest wireless carrier in the country.** The CPUC is investigating the potential impact of the proposed merger on California's consumers and communities. AT&T must answer many questions first, especially about jobs and low-cost service plans, if it wants the CPUC to sign off on the merger.

AT&T's merger application with the Federal Communications Commission failed to address these issues. Significant questions you may bring up:

- How many retail jobs will be lost? How many T-Mobile retail centers will close in diverse communities?

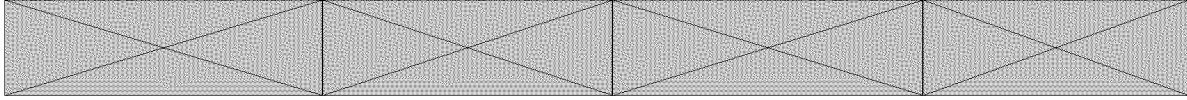
