Sidney Dietz, Director, Regulatory Relations, PG&E, initiated the communication with Colette Kersten, Advisor to Commissioner Catherine Sandoval. Also present was Janice Berman, Sr. Director-CES Policy & Integrated Planning, PG&E. [Rule 8.4(b)]

Mr. Dietz stated that the CPUC has the authority to allow the use of unspent funds so that Energy Efficiency (EE) programs can continue as adopted in D.09-09-047. Mr. Dietz further stated that the use of these unused and uncommitted funds is a simple and elegant solution to the problem of the gas raid, and that it works for all three utilities. Mr. Dietz stated that the ruling contemplates a solution that is complicated

and insufficient to continue EE programs at their current pace. Mr. Dietz further stated

that the gas raid should not be seen as an opportunity to change the portfolio because

any resolution needs to be quick and there are other for a that are more appropriate for

such changes. [Rule 8.4(c)]
