## NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to Rule 8.3 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, The Utility Reform Network (TURN) hereby gives notice of the following *ex parte* communication. On August 16, 2011, TURN attorney Matthew Freedman and TURN consultant Kevin Woodruff spoke with Matthew Tisdale, advisor to Commissioner Mike Florio. The meeting was initiated by Mr. Tisdale, occurred at Mr. Tisdale's office at 505 Van Ness Avenue, commenced at 4:15pm, and lasted approximately 30 minutes.

Mr. Freedman and Mr. Woodruff encouraged Commissioner Florio to support the Track 1 settlement filed in R.10-05-006 on August 3rd. Mr. Freedman explained that the settlement fairly balances the interests of all the parties, provides a process for future consideration of resource needs, and properly incorporates a finding that no new resources are needed at this time for renewable integration purposes. Mr. Woodruff stated that his concerns about the renewable integration modeling inputs and methodology being developed by the California Independent System Operator can be addressed under the process and timeline established in the settlement. No written materials were provided.
