Earlier he led Horizon's market and transmission development in New England and early stage project development efforts in the Rockies. In that role, TJ developed projects in Kit Carson, Cheyenne, and Baca counties, and he helped found and served as co-chair of the Colorado Renewables and Conservation Collaborative, a voluntary industry working group. TJ

has served on the boards of the Interwest Energy Alliance, the Colorado Independent Energy Association, and Renewable Energy New England.

Before joining Horizon, TJ was a consultant with McKinsey's energy practice, based in Washington DC, where he served utility and industrial clients. He earlier worked in Calpine's energy trading group in Houston, analyzing the performance of their fleet of natural gas-fired power plants and guiding trading strategy. TJ started his career as a engineer for The Dow Chemical Company in engineering, operations, R&D, and business development roles. He holds a bachelors of science in mechanical engineering from the University of Texas in Austin and a masters of business administration from Harvard Business School. TJ spent two years serving as a Peace Corps volunteer in Jamaica.
