BACKGROUND

Redacted in Sacramento, a structure fire of unknown cause and origin [on customer side of meter] started at a 135-unit multi-story apartment complex. The Sacramento Fire Dept responded and evacuated all units. Major media began covering the incident at 0639 on Channel 13, Sacramento TV station.

At 0830 it became known that two injuries occurred, at least one serious, requiring in-hospitalization care.

PG&E was notified of this incident by Sacramento Fire Department at 0311. A PG&E Gas Service Representative responded to the scene at 0347 and completed the shutdown of all gas meter manifolds feeding the apartment complex, previously begun by the Fire Department, by 0400. The GSR also began shutting down all meter valves.
