

Trina, Jennifer, and Shilpa- on Thursday, Paul Clanon and I will be talking to the City/County Association of Governments

of San Mateo County. We understand that Laura Doll will be the PG&E rep there.

Some of the issues that the CCAG is interested in are:

1. Reviewing PG&E's inspection records of pipelines, to make sure the pipelines are safe

2. Knowing the dates when PG&E has scheduled pipeline inspections - information they say they have had trouble obtaining from PG&E

Is it possible to get a list of planned hydrotests, MAOP digs, or any other inspections/activities related to gas pipelines that will be occurring within San Mateo County over the next six months by Thursday? What is your local government contact plan to keep communities abreast of activity in the areas?

Can we also get a list of activities (hydrotests, MAOP digs, inspections, leak surveys/patrols, replacements, etc.) related to gas pipelines in San Mateo County over the last 10 years? This may not be feasible by Thursday, but at least give me a ballpark timing (and it should not be past next week) by Thursday.

We would very much like to see PG&E bring someone (sufficiently high up) from the engineering side of the house that can be their point of contact.
