CPUC Information Alert: CPUC Self-Generation Incentive Program Reopens November 15, 2011

The California Public Utilities Commission's Self Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) will resume accepting applications on Tuesday, November 15, 2011, for qualifying distributed energy resource technologies. The SGIP's goal is to stimulate the adoption of distributed generation and storage technologies that contribute to California's greenhouse gas reduction goals. The SGIP, which has been on hold since January 2011, will provide incentives to renewable, ultraclean, and emerging technologies including wind turbines, waste heat to power technologies, pressure reduction turbines, internal combustion engines, microturbines, gas turbines, fuel cells, and advanced energy storage systems.

SGIP incentives will range from \$0.50 per watt to \$2.25 per watt based on technology type. Half of the available incentive will be paid up front, and the remainder of the incentive will be paid over five years based on system performance. Technologies that use renewable fuels will receive an additional incentive of \$2 per watt.
