Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is committed to ensuring the safety of our customers and the public. For the next several days, our crews will be working to secure and protect a natural gas transmission pipeline located underneath a sinkhole or Redacted  Redacted  To assist with the City of San Mateo, PG&E will be assessing the pipeline, making repairs to its protective wrapping and replacing the soil that supports it. Our crews will work as quickly and safely as possible to minimize any inconvenience to you.
Why this work is needed A third-party contractor installing fiber optic cable damaged a 15-inch sewer line owned by the City of San Mateo. PG&E operates a natural gas transmission pipeline located in the same street. This week as repairs were being made by the contractor, a trench was excavated on both sides of the sewer line to give crews access. During the excavation, the trenching caved in and caused a sinkhole that exposed PG&E's pipeline.
Starting November 2. from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m vou will see PG&E trucks and crews in your neighborhood working along Redacted to:
Inspect PG&E's gas transmission line for exterior damage and displacement
Disinfect the pipeline and excavation site to remove any debris from the sewer line
Make repairs to the pipeline's protective wrapping if needed
Replace soil so that the pipeline is adequately supported on all sides
Coordinate with City to safely accommodate roadway reconstruction
What to expect Although we expect to complete the initial work this weekend, additional work will be required and may last several weeks. This work will cause minor disruptions, such as construction noise, traffic control, and planned roadway closures on Delaware Street.
