This email is to provide you with the most up-to-date information should you get calls from media or other stakeholders. We will be following up with additional information as we know it.

Today at approx. 3:30 PM PG&E experienced a failed hydrotest on L132 in [Redacted] near the east side of HW [Reda]

The failure occurred on a 3 foot section of a pipe seam. The pipe is located on a knoll above the [Re] freeway. The escaping water caused a mudslide that closed some lanes on the [Re] freeway.

The Fire Department is working with PG&E to get the mud off the road.

Media is on the scene and the CPUC staff and NTSB have been notified. There are no reported injuries. Additional background is below.

Background:

This was a test of over 4 miles of pipe just north of the separate hydrotest section (T-30) on L132 where there was a small, pin hole leak on Friday. While pressuring up this particular section (T-31) on L-132 today, the pressure dropped from about 500+ psi to 0 indicating a likely pipe rupture.

PG&E terminated the hydrotest, and upon receiving reports of mud on the road between [Redacted] took

action to address and make the situation safe.
