CALIFORNIA ECONOMIC SUMMIT

Organized by the California Stewardship Network and California Forward the California Economic Summit will identify immediate and long-term public and private actions to promote jobs and competitiveness. It will connect regional and state leaders to create a policy agenda to invest in world-class infrastructure, create a skilled workforce and promote job-friendly government across California.

A policy framework is already in place based on recent statewide strategies prepared by the Think Long Committee for California, An Economic Growth and Competitiveness Agenda prepared by Brookings and the McKinsey Global Institute, as well as regional strategies reflecting the diversity of California. Each of these reports has recommended an annual summit.

The focus of the Summit will be realizing California's full economic potential as we emerge from the long recession and putting into place essential policies for sustaining economic growth while removing critical barriers to long-term competitiveness.

The Summit provides a unique opportunity for regional partnerships to spotlight their unique growth industries and the specific requirements of these industries for the future. It will be a bottom-up process that identifies these regional priorities and then defines common policy actions that can be implemented at both the regional and state level. The Summit will build support for implementation by joining the voices of many regions.

THE SUMMIT PROCESS

The Summit will be designed based on the successful experience of the Oregon Business Plan Summits (www.oregonbusinessplan.org) that have

come together to develop specific plans for adoption by the Governor and the state legislature.

The Summit process, through its Leadership Group and Steering Committee as well as participation at its regional forums and the statewide summit, will reflect the regional, economic, political and ethnic diversity of California to inform the final Summit product and build support for implementation.

The Summit process will deploy the latest digital technology to make public sessions as interactive as possible and to incorporate participation from those who can't be physically present with the goal of capturing more wisdom and building more agreement for the action agenda.

FEBRUARY-MARCH 2012 - Complete regional forums
MARCH-APRIL 2012 - Organize the Summit
MAY 2012 - The first annual California Economic Summit
