Subject: PHC A.10-01-014 DCPD seismic study funding

This afternoon Feb 23, 2012 was the PHC for A.10-01-014, which was reopened on Nov 30, 2011, to address PG&E's request for additional \$46 million (total of about \$64 million) for the DCPD seismic studies. The original decision D.10-08-003 authorized \$16.7 million, and created the IPRP. The assigned ALJ is Robert Barnett. Highlights of today's PHC include the following:

- PG&E's Motions to strike testimony of Rochelle Becker and Doug Hamilton for the A4NR were denied. PG&E will be afforded one month to respond to the testimony of Doug Hamilton by March 23. PG&E has already filed a rebuttal to the testimony of Ms Becker.
- Regarding Bagley-Keene, ALJ Barnett is proposing to modify D.10-08-003 to state that the CPUC's Energy Division Director will convene an IPRP, rather than the existing language in the decision that the CPUC will convene an IPRP, which imposes B-K limitations on the IPRP. The A4NR objected and wants the IPRP to continue to be under B-K so that they can attend each and every IPRP meeting and effectively participate and gather information, even though the A4NR is currently not a participant in the IPRP. This issue will be formally discussed at the hearings scheduled for April.
- A scoping memo will be issued to include:
 - Reasonableness of PG&E's scope for the studies and cost
 - Constitution of the IPRP and potential revision to the original decision
 - Cost sharing between shareholders and ratepayers, as proposed by DRA

- SLO County made an appearance at today's PHC. They requested that the IPRP be funded at a minimum of \$900,000, and offered their assistance with executing a contract to hire a technical consultant to the IPRP. SLO County is seeking assurance of sufficient funding for such a consultant.
- Hearings will be scheduled for April 16 – 18, 2012, starting at 10:00 am in one of the Hearing Rooms at the CPUC.
