- There was no emergency declared at Diablo Canyon. During a training scenario today, an alert notification was distributed to some emergency response organization (ERO) personnel (this includes both PG&E personnel and off-site emergency response organizations).
- We apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. The notification for the training scenario was distributed to the ERO rather than the individuals participating in the training. This is being evaluated and processes will be put in place to prevent future distribution errors. Diablo Canyon continues to operate in a safe manner. Both units are operating normally at 100 percent.

Only to be used if asked:

- The original notification was issued at 7:49 a.m. The error was identified and reverse notification actions began at 8:03 a.m.
- We have operations crews in training each week. Operators train on a variety of scenarios.
- The notification for the training scenario was distributed to the ERO rather than the individuals participating in the training. This is being evaluated and processes will be put in place to prevent future distribution errors.
- The ERO responded as designed.
- All agencies followed the appropriate protocols, were transparent and timely in their notifications.
