As we discussed this afternoon, we received from Energy Division the attached outline for our testimony supporting our 2013-2014 energy efficiency application, which was served today on the service list for R.09-11-014. The outline contains page limit guidelines, consistent with the direction in the recent guidance decision, D. 12-05-015, page 364. The total number of pages indicated for the testimony (absent the appendices) is 36. While we completely support Energy Division's goal to keep the testimony as brief as possible, we are concerned that we will be unable to comply with all the requirements in D.12-05-015 within the stated page limits. We are particularly concerned about whether we will be able to adequately explain program changes and our proposals for new financing programs, within the ten pages indicated for Chapter 3 of the outline. We would appreciate hearing from you at your earliest convenience whether the page limitations in the Staff outline are suggested targets or firm limits. We will, of course, endeavor to be as succinct as possible in our testimony.
