Mr. Dietz stated that PG&E appreciates that guidance decision is comprehensive and includes goals and cost-effectiveness methods as well as the clarity around CPUC expectations, and that PG&E sees the changes to the Proposed Decision (PD) as positive. Mr. Dietz stated that the CPUC should not choose an administrator for statewide ME&O in this decision, but should rather require a competitive solicitation,

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and that competition is the best approach to getting the best performance from a contractor. Mr. Dietz further stated that the PD should allow for a later application date. [Rule 8.4(c)]
