I'm very pleased to announce that Trina Horner was elected today by the PG&E Boards of Directors to become Vice President, Regulatory Proceedings and Rates. Trina takes on the position previously held by Jane Yura, who moved to Gas Operations last year to become Vice

President, Gas Operations Standards and Policy.

Trina brings to her new role an impressive array of talents and skills acquired over more than 20 years in the utility industry.

For the past two years, she led the organization in Regulation and Rates responsible for managing several key rate cases, including ERRRA Forecast and Compliance, the Long Term Procurement Plan and new generation facilities. Each of these experiences helped Trina develop the values and traits that make her the excellent leader she is today. She's thoughtful, knowledgeable, and consistently exercises sound judgment. She also thinks strategically, and has a clear vision of where to go and how to get there. And to those of us who know her personally and professionally, she's extremely honest and has a sincere concern and respect for others.

Trina earned her Bachelor's Degree in International Relations, with a Finance emphasis, from the University of California, Davis.
