

The CPUC attended a meeting of the Fontana chapter of the AARP to speak with senior citizens and share information about the role of the CPUC and its consumer programs.

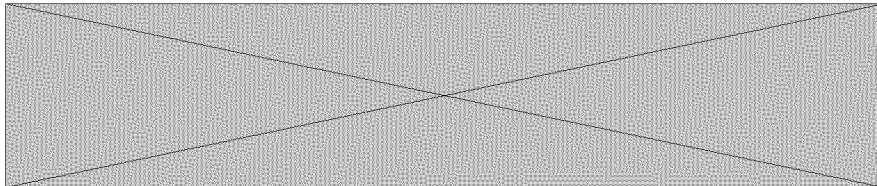

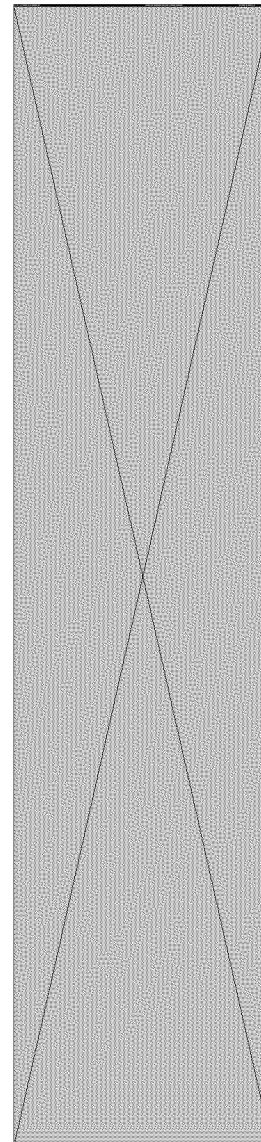
CPUC Approves Carmel River Reroute and San Clemente Dam Removal Project

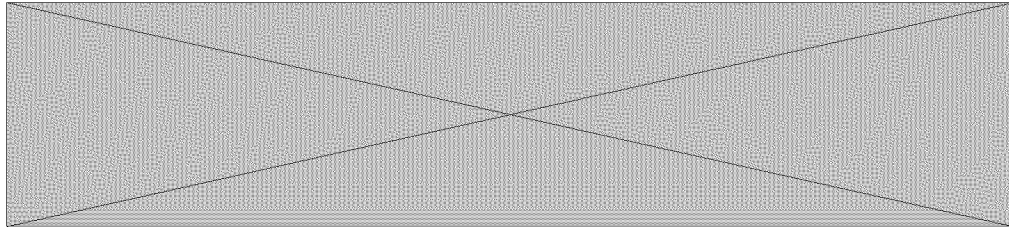
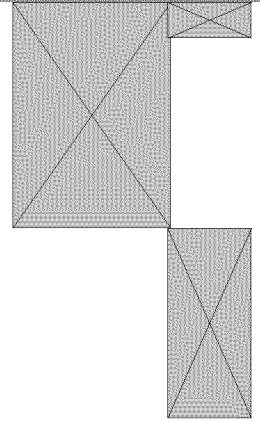
