Thank you for confirming your attendance as panelists at the CPUC Workshop on **Transmission Construction and Bird Nesting Issues-Problems and Solutions.** As you all are now aware, the workshop had to be postponed from June to August 2012 in order to accommodate the Department of Fish and Game very busy schedule. Of the four

1. **Problems and issues resulting from transmission construction during bird nesting season** (examples - problems with implementing laws, mitigation measure language, ineffective nest management plans, not using deterrents, and no advance planning for the season).

2. Solutions to these problems that have been implemented prior to and during construction for these transmission projects (examples – using nesting plans that address deterrence, survey protocols, and buffer restrictions; timing of construction).

3. Additional solutions for existing and future projects to address bird nesting issues that will insure compliance with the relevant laws and timely construction (examples – mitigation or nesting plan language changes, improvements to applicant measures, more or different deterrence implementation, or modification of the relevant laws and regulations).

The Power Points need to be submitted to myself (<u>bcb@cpuc.ca.gov</u>) and Susan Lee (<u>slee@aspeneg.com</u>) by August 20, 2012. We would like to upload all Power Points on one laptop for the panelists' presentations. Given staffing issues, the CPUC would like to offer assistance to any agency in preparing their slides.
