On Aug 14, we received notice of DOE OE cyber R&D award to a team from PNNL (lead),

LLNL, ORNL, and PG&E. This proposal is focused on supply chain integrity challenges for grid software and hardware (see attached). Our participation in this topic area and inclusion of PG&E was motivated by Jamie Sample (Chief Information Security Officer at PG&E) and his visit to LLNL on March 30. We are quite certain that PG&E's participation was an important differentiator for our proposal.
