Energy Division is requesting the following information regarding your portfolio of wind and solar contracts:

- 1. Wind contracts

  - iii. Third-party SC and the nature of the third-party

- 2. Solar Contracts
- a. Total MWs contracted
- b. Total MWs contracted categorized by:
  - i. The LSE acts as scheduling coordinator (SC)
  - ii. The generator acts as its own SC
  - iii. Third-party SC and the nature of the third-party

For instance, if there are 1000 MWs of wind contracts:

750 MWs have the IOU as the SC; 200 MWs have the generator as the SC; and the remaining 50 MWs have a third-party SC

50 MWs of the 750 MWs are allocated in some other manner; and

250 MWs of the 750 MWs are ambiguous or uncertain.
