2012-2014 Energy Savings Assistance and California Alternate Rates for Energy

(Discuss and HOLD TO 8/23/12 BY SIMON) - This PD approves budgets of approximately \$5 billion to continue the Commission's two low income energy assistance programs (ESA and CARE Programs) administered by the IOUs (PG&E, SCE and SDG&E). Dynamic Pricing: Petition to Modify – This PD denies PG&E's Petition for Modification of D.10-02-032 and D.11-11-008 to change mandatory time-of-use (TOU) to "default opt-out" TOU for small and medium commercial and industrial customers and small and medium agricultural customers. Marin Energy Authority (MEA) 2012 Energy Efficiency Program - Draft Res E-4518 certifies Marin Energy Authority's 2012 Energy Efficiency Program Administration Plan, submitted pursuant to PU Code Section 381.1(e) and (f), and orders PG&E to transfer to MEA fourteen percent of all monies collected through nonbypassable charges from MEA retail electricity customers authorized by the Commission for cost-effective energy efficiency and conservation programs.. Cal Solar Initiative Thermal Program – This PD modifies D.10-01-022, which adopted CSI inventive levels, to provide increased incentives in the early steps of the program to both natural gas and electric displacing Solar Water Heating systems for single-family residential customers by 45% and for commercial and multi-family residential customers by 13.33%. Petition on the Annual Financial Audits of IOUs – PD denies without prejudice Petition of the Black Economic Council, National Asian American Coalition, and Latino Business Chamber of Greater Los Angeles for a rulemaking proposing rules regarding the annual financial audits of investor-owned utilities. Power Shut Off: Revisions to Electric Tariff Rules 11 and 16 – Draft Res E-4493 approves California Pacific Electric Company (CalPeco), Golden State Water Company (GSWC), Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E), Pacific Power Corporation (PacifiCorp), San Diego Gas and Electric Company (SDG&E), Southern California Edison Company (SCE), collectively “IOUs” request to incorporate D.12-01-032, Ordering Paragraph 7, which requires revisions to Electric Tariff Rules 11 (Discontinuance and Restoration of Service) and 16 (Service Extension), stating that the IOUs may shut off power to customers who do not allow access to their property for vegetation management activities for fire hazard prevention, subject to certain conditions. Energy Storage: Phase 1 Take up with Consent) – This PD adopts the Final Energy Storage Framework Staff Proposal submitted by Commission Staff, as directed by AB 2514, which identifies 20 “End Use” for energy storage and where in the value chain storage is being used. Petition to Modify D.03-12-035 on OII 02-04-026 (PG&E Chapter 11) – This PD grants the petition for modification of D.03-12-035 filed by Pacific Forest and Watershed Lands Stewardship Council and The Greening Institute to clarify language regarding the permissible uses of ratepayer funds to provide underserved, urban youth with greater opportunities to experience California’s rich natural environment. PU Code Sec 851 (HELD BY STAFF TO 8/23/12) - Draft Res ALJ-268 adopts new General Order, which largely codifies the regulations for the former Public Utilities Code Section 851 pilot program with minor technical and clarifying changes and makes the pilot program permanent. GO 66-C: Disclosure of Records – Draft Res L-438 authorizes disclosure of records of CPUC Consumer Protection and Safety Division’s investigation of an electric incident on June 6, 2012 at Ridgecrest, California, Kern County. [Agenda Item 9] **Regulatory**

Adjudicatory: City of Concord, City of Taft, City of Madera, City of Kerman, City of Clovis vs PG&E – This PD extends statutory deadline for completion of the complaint case to August 21, 2013 for findings that the PG&E incorrectly calculated and underpaid PU Sections 6350-6354.1 et. seq. franchise fee surcharge. (C.11-08-022) [Agenda Item 32] **Regulatory Relations Contact: John Hughes**

Intervenor Cost-of-Living Adjustment (HELD BY STAFF TO 8/23/12) – Draft **Res ALJ-281** denies approval of the Cost-of-Living Adjustment for 2012 intervenor work and continues the hourly rates and other matters established in D.08-04-010. [Agenda Item 7]

SCE: New OII: SONGS (HELD BY FLORIO TO 8/23/12) – This PD opens New Order Instituting Investigation on the Commission's Own Motion into the Rates, Operations, Practices, Services and Facilities of SCE and SDG&E, associated with the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Units 2 and 3, to obtain information on the Units 2 and 3 recent outages, and the resulting effect on the provision of electric service at just and reasonable rates. [Agenda Item 5]

SCE: Agreement Modifications - Draft **Res E-4513** approves one-time modifications to SCE's CREST Excess Sales Agreement for the United States Forest Service and changes to Interconnection Agreements for Federal Agencies. [Agenda Item 25]

SDG&E ERRRA - This PD authorizes, pursuant to AB 57, SDG&E an increase in rates to collect the projected \$49.9 million undercollection from ratepayers, to be amortized over a 12-month period beginning no later than September 1, 2012. This proceeding is closed. [Agenda Item 21]

SDG&E: El Dorado Power Plant Facility – Draft **Res E-4465** approves SDG&E's purchase price of the El Dorado Power Plant (now named the Desert Star Energy Center) and the proposed revenue requirement for non-fuel costs beginning October 1, 2011 through December 1, 2015. Revenues will be tracked through SDG&E's Non-Fuel Generation Balancing Account. [Agenda Item 16]

California Pacific Electric Company, LLC (CalPeco): RPS Memorandum Account – Draft **Res E-4492** denies CalPECO's request for authorization to establish a memorandum account entitled Renewables Portfolio Standard Memorandum Account

(RPSMA) to record certain administrative expenses associated with renewable-related proceedings at various California state agencies and outside third-party expenses for renewable procurement. [Agenda Item 17]

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Legislative and Other Matters

AB 723 (Bradford): Energy: Public Goods Charge (Take up with Consent) - This bill would extend the sunset on the electrical rate component commonly referred to as the "Public Goods Charge" to January 1, 2020. [Agenda Item 41]

AB 1186 (Skinner): California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006: Investor-Owned Utilities: School Energy Efficiency (Take up with Consent) - This bill would prohibit the CPUC from approving an IOUs expenditure plan for greenhouse gas emissions allowances unless an unspecified percentage of those proceeds is made available for certain cost-effective school energy efficiency improvements for schools in the IOU's service area. [Agenda Item 43]

AB 1755 (Perea): Electricity: Rates (HELD BY STAFF TO 8/23/12) - This bill would authorize the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to approve a fixed per-customer electricity charge not based upon usage that applies to all customers of an electrical corporation, including California Alternatives Rates for Energy program participants, to recover fixed costs of providing service, if the CPUC finds that such a charge is just and reasonable and is necessary to provide rate relief to upper tier residential customers of the electrical corporation. AB 1900 (Gatto): Renewable Energy Resources: Biomethane (HELD BY STAFF TO 8/23/12) - This bill would require the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to develop reasonable, prudent, and minimally restrictive testing protocols for gas collected from a solid waste landfill that is to be injected into a common carrier pipeline to determine if the gas contains chemicals known to the state to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity and would require a gas corporation to accept biomethane into its pipeline, provided the biomethane meets the heating and purity requirements established by the CPUC. AB 2390 (Chesbro): Electricity: Biomass: Incentive Programs (Take up with Consent) – This bill requires the California Energy Commission to provide incentives to producers and collectors of biomass material associated with forest fuel reduction and fire activities. [Agenda Item 46]

SB 843 (Wolk): Energy: Electrical Corporations: City of Davis PVUSA Solar Facility: Community-Based Renewable Energy Self-Generation Program (Take up with Consent) - This bill would authorize a retail customer of an electrical corporation acquire an interest in a community renewable energy facility for the purpose of receiving a bill credit to offset all or a portion of the participant's electricity usage, consistent with specified requirements. SB 1122 (Rubio): Energy: Renewable Biomass and Biogas Projects (HELD BY SANDOVAL TO 8/23/12) - This bill would require the California Public Utilities Commission to adopt a methodology, by June 1, 2014, that accounts for the benefits to ratepayers and the environment from reducing air pollution and global warming emissions by generating electricity from specified sources of biogas and biomass. [Agenda Item 48]

SB 1130 (de Leon): Energy: Energy Assessment: Commercial Buildings: Financing (Take up with Consent) - This bill would require the California Energy Commission, on or before January 1, 2016, to analyze and evaluate standards for commercial energy building retrofits previously developed by various national and international organizations to provide uniformity and transparency for financial institutions evaluating loan proposals for energy improvements to commercial properties. [Agenda Item 49]

SB 1572 (Pavley): California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006: AB 32 Investment Fund (Take up with Consent) - This bill, with certain exceptions, would require revenues collected by the state board and derived from the auction or sale of allowances to be deposited in the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Account which the bill would establish. Under the bill, a specified portion of the money in the funds would be available, subject to appropriation by the Legislature, to administering agencies to fund prescribed projects that meet certain goals relating to greenhouse gas emissions reductions.
