Mr. Jacobson and Mr. Griffes discussed some of the key issues associated with the Flexible Capacity workshop scheduled for Monday, August 13, 2012. They discussed some of the procedural history of this issue and the growing need for flexible capacity to integrate increasing levels of intermittent renewable resources. Mr. Griffes

stated that one of PG&E's priorities was finding an appropriate balance between the amount of flexibility in the system and customer costs. He also emphasized the importance of balancing the desire to act expeditiously against the need for a longer term, more comprehensive solution. [Rule 8.4(c)]
