Bottle Rock contributes to reliability in the North Bay area and Lakeville and Fulton subareas. While these areas currently have enough resources to meet local capacity requirements, the ISO is forecasting that all resources in these areas will be needed for local reliability by 2016. This transaction is long-term and will contribute to the ongoing local reliability for these areas and offset some of PG&E's longer-term need to purchase resource adequacy from other local area resources.
