**NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF PACIFIC GAS AND  
ELECTRIC COMPANY'S (U39 M) NOTICE OF INTENT  
TO FILE A TEST YEAR 2014 GENERAL RATE CASE**

PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY (PG&E) hereby provides this Notice of Availability of its Notice of Intent (NOI) to file an application for a test year 2014 general rate case (GRC).

On July 2, 2012, PG&E tendered its NOI to the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA). On September 14, 2012, DRA notified Chief Administrative Law Judge Karen Clopton and PG&E that DRA had accepted the NOI. A copy of DRA's letter is attached. Pursuant to the Commission's Rate Case Plan, PG&E's 2014 GRC application may be filed no sooner than 60 days after DRA's acceptance of the NOI. (D.07-07-004, page A-12.)

Within five days after PG&E's NOI has been accepted by DRA, PG&E is required to serve a Notice of Availability of its NOI on all appearances in its last general rate case. (D.07-07-004, page A-11.) PG&E's NOI and related materials include the NOI itself, a draft application, separately bound prepared testimony, and related workpapers, which taken together are several thousands of pages.<sup>1/</sup> (PG&E intends to offer into evidence the workpapers, as well as the testimony.)

Pursuant to Rule 1.9(d) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, PG&E will

On July 2, 2012, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) tendered its Notice of Intent (NOI) to file a General Rate Case (GRC) application for rates effective January 1, 2014.

Pursuant to the most recent Rate Case Plan (RCP) adopted in Decision (D.) 07-07-004, which modified D.89-01-040, the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) advised PG&E of deficiencies and has reviewed the utility's deficiency responses. In DRA's view, PG&E has substantially cleared the deficiencies and complied with the Commission's RCP. Therefore, DRA recommends that PG&E's NOI be accepted at this time, with the understanding that PG&E will continue to address any outstanding items.
