Paul – as you are aware, we have responded to a request for assistance under mutual aid agreements to ConEd and other effected utilizes is on the East Coast. PG&E has sent approximately 150 personnel to help the more than 8 million customers who are without power. We've been asked if we can do more. If we send additional personnel, it could put us out of compliance in certain areas. We would not send additional crews eastward if it were to jeopardize our customers health and safety. That said, we are concerned about being out of compliance, even temporarily, unless the Commission waived those compliance terms on a temporary basis. Should we pursue this approach ? Let me know.
