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Pursuant to Rule 1.4 of the Commission's Rules of P ractice and Procedure, the National Asian American Coalition, Latino Business Chamber o f Greater Los Angeles, Ecumenical Center for Black Church Studies, and the Chinese Am erican Institute for Empowerment (hereinafter "Joint Parties") hereby respectfully r equest to be granted party status in this proceeding. The National Asian American Coalition and the Latino Business Chamber of Greater Los Angeles have been involved in numerous cases before the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC").

All of our efforts will be coordinated amongst ours elves, since we recognize that the opportunities for success are dependent upon recognition of our mutual interests. In addition, we will seek coordination with all parties seeking to ensure and enhance greater opportunities for underserved consumers, minorities, and where possible, general consumer interests.

I. Joint Parties' Areas of Interest

The nature of the Joint Parties' involvement in thi s investigation will be related to the reasonableness and prudency of both Southern California Edison ("SCE") and San Diego Gas & Electric's ("SDG&E") response to the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station ("SONGS") as it relates to community outreach and overall ratepayer education.

Under Public Utilities Code Section 451, the Commis sion is required to ensure that "every public utility shall furnish and maintain su ch adequate, efficient, just, and reasonable service, instrumentalities, equipment, and faciliti es. . . as are necessary to promote the safety, health, comfort, and convenience of its patrons, em ployees, and the public." ¹ The Joint Parties seek to contribute their expertise to aid the Commi ssion in its review of the reasonableness of SCE and SDG&E's post-shutdown actions, as they invo lve those communities proximate to SONGS and statewide. This comports with the Scopin g Memo's aim to investigate those matters which relate to the health and comfort of s urrounding communities, particularly any and all costs associated with the shutdown.

The Joint Parties seek an evaluation of the safety plans, education programs, and outreach efforts which were implemented following the SONGS shut down, and will work to evaluate the reasonableness and efficacy of those plans, especia lly as they concern communities of color and low income areas.

These issues take on a heightened importance due to the concerns and misinformation surrounding nuclear power, as well as in the contex t of the San Bruno gas line explosion. The National Asian American Coalition, which is headquartered in San Bruno, is keenly aware of the

emotional and psychological toll that an infrastruc ture malfunction and utility error can exact on surrounding residents. It is in everyone's interes t that these consequences be addressed by companies who maintain and operate those facilities , and accordingly, the actions of SCE and SDG&E post-shutdown merit attention.
