Hi Erik,

The ALJ in the ReMAT Proceeding has asked me to check with the IOUs to get their thoughts on how much more standardization could be accomplished between the three utilities on their Re-MAT Tariffs.

What kind of timeline would the IOUs need if the ALJ were to ask the utilities to revisit the Draft Re-MAT Tariffs and to make them more standardized, also taking into account comments filed to the Tariffs in August and September? Can the utilities even achieve a higher level of standardization? Are there outstanding issues that the ALJ can help with that would make this an easier task? Etc.

At the very least, if there are insurmountable challenges (ie, to standardize with the other IOUs would require overhauling how the entire utility structures and formats its tariffs), please let me know that. I think the ALJ is simply looking for as much uniformity/standardization as we can get, not perfect standardization.

To the extent you can get me some feedback on this from PG&E's perspective, it'd be much appreciated. What can be done, are there insurmountable barriers to this type of standardization, and how long would it take to resubmit something, etc.
