**MOTION OF THE
COALITION OF CALIFORNIA UTILITY EMPLOYEES
TO BECOME A PARTY**

Pursuant to Rule 1.4 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, the Coalition of California Utility Employees (“CUE”) respectfully submits its motion to become a party to this proceeding.

CUE has been interested in the development of this proceeding and, until now, has been registered on an “information-only basis.” At this time, CUE would like to join this proceeding as a party and thereby transfer from “information only” status to party status in order to actively participate in this proceeding and submit comments.

CUE is a coalition of unions whose approximately 35,000 members work at essentially all of the California electric utilities; both publicly owned, and privately owned. CUE has been active in proceedings before the CPUC since 1994. The potential implementation of the procurement targets for energy storage systems directly impacts the electric utilities in California and CUE would like to offer comments and suggestions on the legal and practical aspects of that
