RE: Request for Extension of Time to Comply with Ordering Paragraph 2 of Decision 12-04-012 (A.11-06-026)

Dear Mr. Cherry:

On April 16, 2013, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) requested that the Commission grant an extension of time to comply with Decision (D.) 12-04-012 regarding the requirement to implement "new world generation charges" applicable to continuous direct access customers who returned to bundled service and then returned to direct access service.

Ordering Paragraph (OP) 2 of D.12-04-012 states that "Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern Californian Edison Company and San Diego Gas & Electric Company shall implement the changes needed to bring their tariffs and billing practices into conformity with the clarifications to Decision 08-09-012 adopted in Ordering Paragraph 1 within 12 months of the mailing of this order." The mailing of the order was on April 24, 2012.

In an April 16, 2013 letter, PG&E requests an extension of time to April 1, 2014 to comply with OP 2. The letter states that PG&E is currently working on a series of billing system changes and states that "[a]llowing PG&E to implement the new world generation charges after PG&E has launched its new bill redesign would allow for a smooth transition of the new world generation charges into the new bill format." PG&E also notes that "new world generation charges would impact only 23 customer accounts."

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I find, pursuant to Rule 16.6, that the request is reasonable and will grant PG&E's requested extension of time to April 1, 2014 to comply with OP 2 of D.12-04-012. As required by the rule, PG&E must serve an electronic copy of this letter on the service lists of Application 11-06-026.
