## **QUESTION 9**

Exhibit PG&E-4, Workpaper 5-8, line 6, in reference to street light group replacements, states, "In 2011, the number of completed replacements was low due to prioritization, but in order to meet the agreement with Contra Costa county it must remain at approximately 5,000 per year throughout the forecast years."

- a. What agreement does PG&E have with Contra Costa County for street light group replacements? How many lights is PG&E replacing under the agreement? What type of lights are being replaced?
- b. Could the lights being replaced under the agreement with Contra Costa County participate in PG&E's proposed LED conversion program?

## **ANSWER 9**

- a. Attachment GRC2014-Ph-I\_DR\_CAL-SLA\_001-Q09Atch01 is the Letter regarding the Contra County Street Light Service Level Agreement ("Letter Agreement"). Per Section 4 of the Letter Agreement, "PG&E will perform Group Lamp Replacements based on a five year schedule to replace all lamps maintained by PG&E." PG&E replaced 6,300 lights from 2007 to 2012. The total number of PG&E maintained lights in Contra Costa County is approximately 34,000 lights. The replacement work has been a light for light replacement with high pressure sodium vapor (HPSV) lights.
- b. Contra Costa County could participate in PG&E's proposed LED conversion program but, per the current Street Light Tariffs, it would have to pay for the incremental cost between the HPSV and LED fixtures for any fixtures that were converted.
