I. Sunrun's Interest in the Proceeding

Sunrun is the nation's leading home solar service provider, having installed over 34,000 systems in California, Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Oregon and Pennsylvania. Sunrun pioneered the use of solar leases and power purchase agreements to provide residential customers in California with low barriers to investing in solar power. Sunrun installs, owns, insures and maintains the solar panels on a homeowner's roof, while families pay a low rate for clean energy and fix their electric costs for 20 years.

This proceeding will directly impact Sunrun's core business model. Rate design sends price signals to inform the decisions of residential customers regarding whether to invest in solar energy systems. The existing tiered rate structure has been in place during a period of unprecedented growth in the solar industry. As a provider of residential solar services, Sunrun is directly impacted by any changes to the existing rate design and has a strong interest in this proceeding.
