I. EDF RENEWABLE ENERGY’S INTEREST IN THIS PROCEEDING

Headquartered in San Diego and directly employing over 300 employees in California in four offices through the state, EDF Renewable Energy is a developer, owner and operator of wind, solar, biomass, and biogas resources. In the U.S., EDF Renewable Energy has developed over 3,600 MW of wind projects, over 230 MW of solar photovoltaic projects, and 100 MW of biomass/biogas projects, including numerous wind and solar projects throughout California. More specifically to this proceeding, EDF Renewable Energy is developing a pumped hydro storage project in southern Oregon that can directly benefit California ratepayers.

This Motion for Party Status is filed by EDF Renewable Energy in order to be able to file comments on the June 10, 2013, *Assigned Commissioner’s Ruling Proposing Storage Procurement Targets and Mechanisms and Noticing All-Party Meeting*. In addition to filing comments, EDF Renewable Energy contemplates additional appropriate participation as an

active party in this proceeding. EDF Renewable Energy's interests are not represented by any other party to this proceeding, and its comments are directly relevant to the issues.
