ALJ Long:

We are now scheduled to hold hearings in PG&E's Rate Design Window case next week from July 8 to 12. Several parties have asked me to pass on the request that the hearing take place on Tuesday, July 9 and Wednesday, July 10, rather than beginning on the 8th.

In this case, the Solar Energy Industries Association (SEIA) seeks approval of a new rate Option R for E-19 and E-20 customers. Testimony has been served by four witnesses, Tom Beach for SEIA; Steve Chriss on behalf of Wal-Mart and Sam's West; Dennis Keane on behalf of PG&E; and Jim Ross on behalf of the Energy Producers and Users Coalition (EPUC). I have polled the parties, and received estimates indicating that the total cross examination time by the parties should take no more than seven hours. The estimates follow:
