Greetings: The “disposition” letter for PG&E advice no. 4074-E is not correct. In Resolution E-4529, the Commission rejected PG&E’s advice letter, but allowed PG&E to file a new advice letter with an amended contract in order for the Commission to review and approve it. PG&E filed such an advice letter on August 23 (Advice No. 4275-E). I do not think that advice no. 4074-E should become “effective” at all.

Under the current process when the CPUC's Energy Division Suspends or Disposes of a Tier 1 or 2 Advice Letter, a service list is not noticed, only the utility and any protesters receive a notice.

Currently, electronic copies of Advice Letters are not available on the CPUC's website and the only way to find out if an Advice Letter has been Suspended or Disposed of is by visiting the Utility's website for status updates.

In the spirit of providing greater transparency and access to information in the Advice Letter

process, the Energy Division's Tariff Unit will begin e-mailing Advice letter Disposition, Suspension, and Withdrawal letters to the Utility's G.O. 96-B Service List as a courtesy.
