HISTORY: On November 20, 1820, the crew of this ship noticed a whale, much larger than normal, acting strangely. It was motionless on the surface with its head facing the ship then began moving towards the vessel picking up speed. The whale rammed the ship, moved beneath the ship and surfaced on the starboard side appearing to be stunned and motionless. The first mate prepared to harpoon it but noticed that its tail was only inches from the rudder which would be destroyed if the whale was provoked. The whale recovered and swam several hundred yards ahead of the ship and turned to face the ship. The first mate was quoted as saying, "I turned around and saw him about one hundred rods ( 550 yards) directly ahead of us, coming down with twice his ordinary speed (around 24 knots or $44 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$ ), and it appeared with tenfold fury and vengeance in his aspect.". The ship was sunk and is thought to have become one of the inspirations for the novel MOBY DICK. What was the name of the ship?
