To Parties to A.12-07001, R.0911014, R.1005004 and R. 1211005,

The California Public Utilities Commission adopted the California Long Term Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan in 2008, in D. 08-09-040. This Plan proposed several ambitious Zero Net Energy Building Goals, including the goal that all new residential building construction will reach "zero net energy" (ZNE) performance (including clean, onsite distributed generation) for all new single and multifamily homes by 2020.

Zero Energy buildings involve installation of highly efficient technologies, demand response and distributed generation options. To reflect this, Energy Division on November 28, 2012 invited members of the above proceedings to a workshop to review two PG&E Zero Net Energy Building technical and policy studies, and to launch a stakeholder process to develop a New Residential Zero Net Energy Building Action Plan

Some sixty stakeholders subsequently participated in a year-long process to develop a draft New Residential ZNE Action Plan, which is now posted and available for comment
