RE: PG&E Request for Extension to Comply with Resolution E-4611

Dear Mr. Cherry:

On November 18, 2013, on behalf of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), you requested an extension of time to execute a contract with the California Center for Sustainable Energy (CCSE) as required by Ordering Paragraph 3 of Resolution E-4611, from November 18, 2013 to December 3, 2013.

Ordering Paragraph 3 of Resolution E-4611 requires PG&E to execute within 30 days of approval of the Resolution a contract extension or new contract with CCSE to perform customer education and outreach activities related to the return of greenhouse gas revenues pursuant to Decision 12-12-033 in Rulemaking (R.) 11-03-012. Resolution E-4611, approved by the Commission on October 17, 2013, directs PG&E, Southern California Edison Company, and San Diego Gas and Electric Company to consign their 2013 outreach and education budgets to CCSE to develop and administer a competitively neutral statewide greenhouse gas outreach and education program.

In your letter, you state that PG&E and CCSE are working diligently to come to agreement on a final contract; however, the parties require more time to review the terms and conditions and thus seek an extension to December 3, 2013 to execute a final contract. You state in your letter that PG&E has consulted CCSE on this request and that CCSE is in agreement with the proposed extension timeframe.

Your request for an extension is reasonable and is granted. PG&E must execute a final contract with CCSE to perform the scope of work set forth in Resolution E-4611 by December 3, 2013.

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PG&E filed this extension request on November 18, 2013 – the date the contract with CCSE was to be executed pursuant to Resolution E-4611. In the future, to allow adequate time for the Commission to consider such requests, PG&E is advised to file requests reasonably in advance of the deadline for which it seeks an extension.

As required by the Commission's rules, PG&E shall notify the service list of R.11-03-012 that this extension was granted.
