# L-114 Weld Verification Citation

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## L-114 Pipeline Replacement Outreach

- Prior to mobilization of any PSEP pipeline replacement, such as the L-114 replacement in Brentwood, PG&E project teams coordinate with local jurisdictions regarding coordination and permitting. In addition, PG&E executes an extensive community outreach strategy consisting of open houses, direct mail to neighboring customers, canvassing and presentations to city councils.
- PG&E presented to the Brentwood City Council in April 2012, prior to construction, and provided several updates to the City Council during construction.

## Weld Verification Communications

- PG&E has coordinated closely with Brentwood City Management and Public Works regarding weld verification activities.
- Given the necessary work to verify the welds and unexpected duration of the construction, PG&E worked with Brentwood Public Works to permit the work and provided regular updates to the City Manager's Office.
- PG&E also provided an update in August 2013 to the Brentwood City Council on the testing of the welds, and an update in September 2013 at the Mayor's State of the City Address.

## Notice of Citation for Non-Compliance

- Once the CPU issued PG&E a citation for the welds, PG&E Government Relations provided the City Manager and Contra Costa County Administrator with an overview of the citation, communicated the work plan to verify the welds and provided the CPU with an affidavit, verifying that proper notification had been made to local authorities. 2



# CPUC Citation and Self-Reporting Process

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Communicating the citation or self-report to local jurisdictions

- Once PG&E files a self-reported non-compliance issue, or is issued a citation for non-compliance, PG&E Local Government Relations Representatives make the following notifications to the County Administrator or City Manager of the jurisdiction where the non-compliance takes place:
  - An e-mail reviewing the non-compliance issue and detailing remediation measures taken to address the immediate issue, as well as territory-wide.
  - A copy of the filing letter sent to regulators related to the non-compliance issue.
  - Any supporting documents, such as maps, that may better help explain the issue.

Verifying to CPUC that proper notification was made

- After notifications have been made to local jurisdictions, the respective Local Government Relations Representative signs an affidavit verifying communication.
- The affidavit, along with copies of the notifications, are then provided to PG&E Regulatory Relations to be transmitted to the CPUC.

Citation and Self-Reporting Processes

- The processes for both citations and self-reporting are the same and notifications are made to both County and City management.
