The California League of Food Processors (CLFP) respectfully moves for party status in Rulemaking 13-11-005 in accordance with Section 1.4 of the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) Rules of Practice and Procedure.

CLFP is a non-profit trade association based in Sacramento that represents food processing companies with operations in California. CLFP represents its members regarding a range of regulatory issues related to energy rates and services and has participated in numerous proceedings before the Public Utilities Commission.

II. CALIFORNIA LEAGUE OF FOOD PROCESSORS’ INTEREST IN THIS PROCEEDING

CLFP seeks party status in this proceeding in order to participate in issues to be addressed going forward as identified in the Notice of Prehearing Conference and administrative Law Judge’s Ruling for this proceeding.
