ADVICE LETTER 2562-E (U 902-E)

PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

REQUEST FOR AUTHORITY FOR SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY SUBJECT:

> TO ACT AS CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES AGENT FOR THE KERN RIVER FIRM TRANSPORTATION AGREEMENT NO. 1724

INTRODUCTION

In this Advice Letter filing, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) requests authorization to act as an agent for California Department of Water Resources (CDWR) for the Kern River Firm Transportation Service Agreement No. 1724 (TSA 1724).

BACKGROUND

California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) approved in Decision (D.) 13-11-003 a Settlement Agreement between SDG&E, Southern California Edison Company, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company regarding TSA 1724. Parties agreed in the Settlement Agreement that SDG&E shall seek authority from the Commission to execute such agreements with CDWR, as may be necessary for SDG&E to provide assistance to CDWR in the management of the shipper's rights under TSA 1724. SDG&E believes it would be beneficial to California electric customers to act as CDWR's agent for the purpose of managing the capacity contracted under TSA 1724 and scheduling the use of that capacity.

In D.13-11-003, it was stated that "(t)he Commission does not predetermine the efficacy of SDG&E's assistance to CDWR regarding the management of TSA 1724 ... but agree that SDG&E shall seek authority from the Commission to execute such agreements and incur costs related to such actions." SDG&E, as stated herein, is seeking authority to execute "Kern River Gas Transmission Company Agency Delegation Agreement Shipper to Agent" (Delegation Agreement). SDG&E will not incur any costs related to the Delegation Agreement, as CDWR will continue to be financially responsible for the TSA.

Attached in Appendix A is the draft of the Delegation Agreement that would be executed when the Commission approves this advice letter.

EFFECTIVE DATE

SDG&E believes this filing is subject to Energy Division disposition and should be classified as Tier 1 pursuant to GO 96-B. SDG&E respectfully requests that this filing become effective on December 20, 2013, which is the date of this filing.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, this designation and appointment of Agent shall automatically terminate upon termination or cancellation of the Agreement(s).
