Thanks for following up Dennis.

The person is [Redacted], and he will call you, probably in January. The original concept was that we would try to find some contractors whose failure to call USAA had resulted in a previously reportable accident that your team might already have reviewed and in your system. Then Gen Hagan would have a basis to take some action.

Its not yet clear that we have good candidates for that. Meanwhile the licensing board is moving forward on a couple companies, and we are kicking off our new program in January. We think that will be better suited to tracking offenders and could offer an opportunity for cpuc action. That is, when we have a cpuc- reportable incident involving one of the bad actors, we could alert you and request special attention.

Hope that makes sense.
