NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to Rule 8.4(a) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby gives notice of the following ex parte communication. The communication occurred on Tuesday, January 14, 2014, at approximately 10:30 a.m., at the offices of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) in San Francisco. The communication was oral only. [Rule 8.4(a)]

Sidney Dietz, Director, Regulatory Relations, PG&E, initiated the communication with Michael Colvin, Advisor to Commissioner Mark Ferron. Also present was Janice Berman, Senior Director of Customer Energy Solutions, Energy Efficiency Strategy, PG&E. Rule 8.4(b)]

Mr. Dietz stated PG&E recognizes that different types of energy efficiency programs may have different cost-effectiveness results. Mr. Dietz further stated that some types of residential and multifamily programs, particularly those aimed at deep savings, may be less cost-effective than other programs in a broad portfolio. Ms. Berman noted that a requirement for a CPUC audit would be consistent with the desire

to understand the results of the CCA program, and should be included as a requirement. [Rule 8.4(c)]
