NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to Rule 8.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure,
The Utility Reform Network (TURN) hereby gives notice of the following *ex parte*communication.

On January 31, 2014, at approximately 12:30 p.m., Marcel Hawiger, staff attorney with TURN, met with Rachel Peterson, advisor to Commissioner Mike Florio. The conversation regarding R.12-06-013 took place on the steps outside the CPUC building and lasted approximately 5 minutes.

Mr. Hawiger summarized TURN's recommendation that the NEM transition period close in 2020 for residential customers, with a possible later date for commercial customers. Mr. Hawiger stated that the position that the transition period end with the expected useful life of the equipment would entirely negate the legislative intent to minimize the amount of cost shifting from

NEM participants to non-participants. The Legislature in AB 327 stipulated a "transition period," not a "grandfathering" of existing customers.
